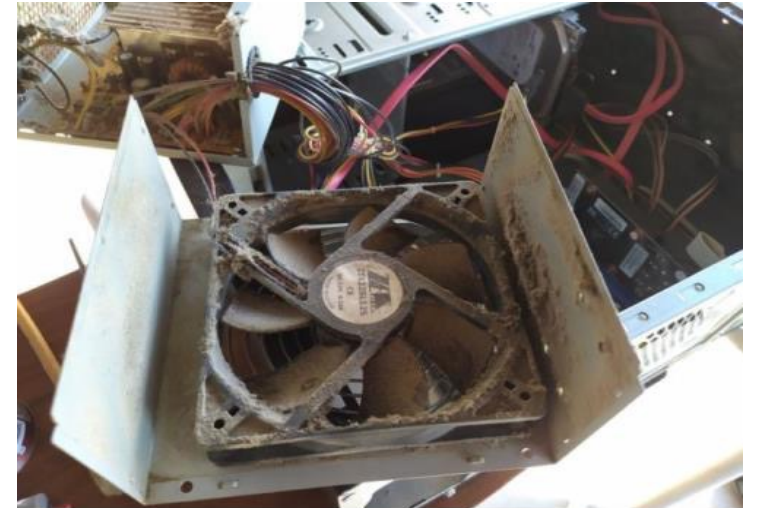
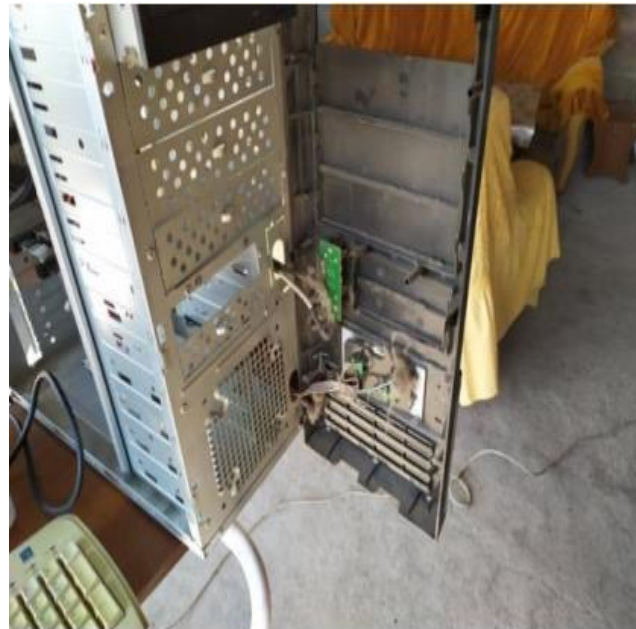
## Armenia Chapter

Services and Internet connection for used computers donated to schools within the framework of COVID initiative

1. Because of COVID spread, all schools of Armenia were transferred to on-line education. As there was a lack of computers in schools and private ownership, the government of Armenia called IT companies to provide their old, used computers to schools. It was done. Computers were donated to schools by IT companies. However, those computers were mostly non-operational, have missing parts, like RAM, network adapters, old motherboard batteries, coolers, and outdated software. ISOC Armenia Chapter considers the IT help to the vulnerable groups one of its main tasks and decided to take the job. There is also a need of Internet-connected computer at home for school students. Our goal was to restore 50 used computers donated to schools to the operational level. The objective was to make online education possible for school students.

ISOC Armenia Chapter is widely known for its help to schools and libraries. We are now servicing a lot of rural schools and libraries either remotely with the help of Anydesk program or off-line when schools and libraries deliver their non-working computers to us.

2. Hardware repairs of school and student home computers included:  
-Cleaning of computer cases



It is seen on the pictures how dusty are the inner parts of the computer cases. The dust can violate the normal operation of a computer, so it should necessarily be cleaned.

Replacement of overheated CPUs



Repair or replacement of computer power supply units



Cleaning of coolers, repair, lubrication or replacement



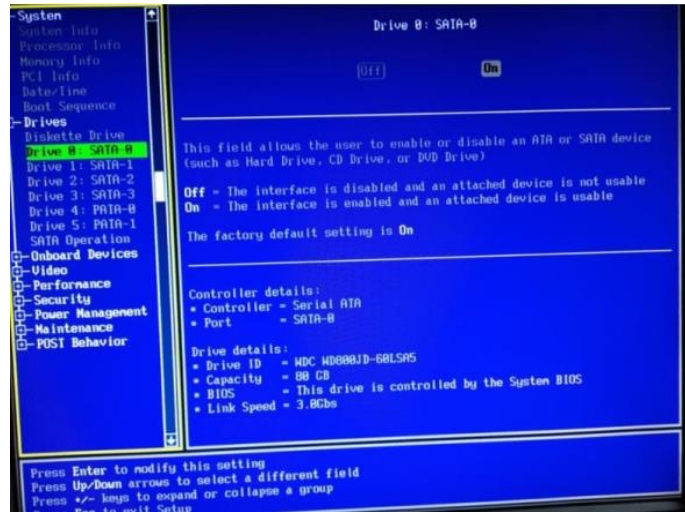
## Installation of operating systems

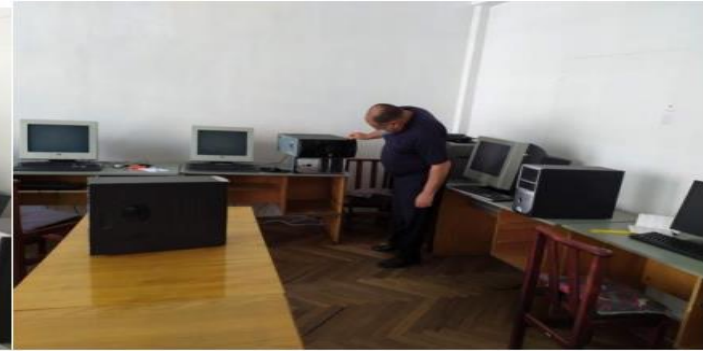

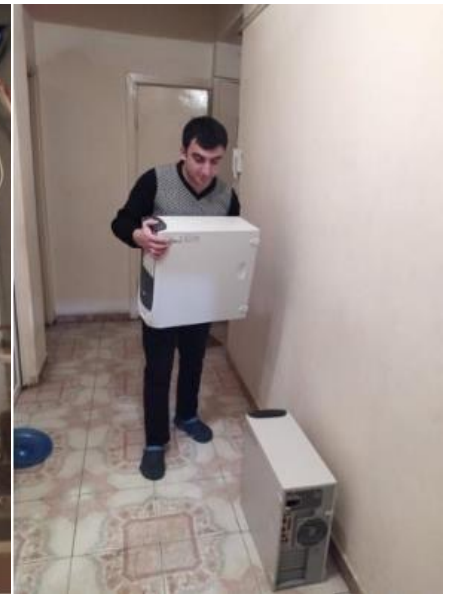
